## **Philipstown Community Survey**

<u>Purpose of this community survey</u>: The purpose of this community survey is to measure the "carbon footprint" of the Town of Philipstown. Measuring a "carbon footprint" means estimating how many pounds of greenhouse gases (GHGs), such as carbon dioxide, households in the Town emit into the atmosphere and how many pounds of GHGs households can store in soil. With this data, you can help our Town to develop a "Climate Action Plan" to reduce our collective GHG emissions and make consumption choices that support our local economy.

The Town of Philipstown is a pledged "Climate Smart Community," which is a New York State program that works with municipalities to reduce GHG emissions. One of the activities required of "Climate Smart Communities" is to measure community GHG emissions. The Town is working with the Ecological Citizen's Project and ICLEI, USA to conduct this community survey. **Eligibility**: Households in the Town of Philipstown are eligible to complete this survey. The Town of Philipstown includes households in zip codes 10524 and 10516; Continental Village, Cold Spring, Garrison, Nelsonville and North Highlands. The household respondent must be 18 years or older to complete the survey.

<u>Survey risks and benefits</u>: There are no risks to participating in this community survey. This survey is voluntary and any household in Philipstown, NY, is eligible to participate. There is no penalty for not participating or for withdrawing at any time. The benefit of participating in this survey is that the respondent/household will assist the Town of Philipstown with developing the most appropriate Climate Action Plan.

Confidentiality: The personal information of respondents will be kept confidential. This survey collects a respondent's name and address, which is used to verify residence in the Town of Philipstown. This survey also gives the option for the respondent to provide an email address and phone number, which would be used to contact the respondent with follow-up questions, if applicable. All respondents will be assigned a case number so that personal contact information can be stored separately from survey data. Electronic files are stored on a password-protected computer and all personal contact information is stored in a separate file from survey data. Any paper files are stored in locked filing cabinets, with personal contact information stored separately from survey data. Furthermore, all data will be de-identified and analyzed in the aggregate. Only the principal investigators of the survey will have access to these electronic and paper files. Personal data will never be shared with another organization or entity.

<u>Compensation</u>: Respondents will be entered into a raffle to win prizes from locally-sourced businesses upon completion of the survey.
